February 20, 2025 Zia Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

The February 20, 2025 BOD meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Bear Canyon Senior Center, with Club President Pat Mileshosky presiding. Aquorum of the BOD was achieved with 17 out of 21 members in attendance.

Item I - Approval of Agenda and Minutes

The meeting Agenda was approved with three additions: railroad ties, storage container repairs, and youth to address board.

The January meeting Minutes were approved without changes.

Item II - Treasurer's report

Sharon Foreman gave the Treasurer's Report. Sharon reviewed the Statement of Activity (SoA) from January and discussed Activity budgets. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

Item III Legislative Action Committee Report

Nate reported that Santa Fe has been very slow filing bills. Committees are looking at several items. 'Assault' weapons ban bill is unlikely to move but will keep the Club apprised.

Item IV - Old Business

Vic Echeverria described some issues with Action Handgun storage. The wooden shed needs replacement and the door of the main storage container is extremely difficult to close. Discussed options culminating on a look into moving the wooden shed gear into the unused shipping container after updating with ventilation and Pat will bring a repair guy out to the range to see what can be done with the main container's door.

Pat Mileshosky started the discussion of raising Club dues. Data put together by Heidi and Sharon was shared with the Board to show the need, and multiple options were put on the table. There was a lot of excellent discussion, culminating on a motion for a roll call vote where each member voted for an option. The motion was seconded, and the vote taken, with 94% of the board selecting the option to set the dues to \$175 for regular members, \$110 for seniors, and \$30 for associates.

Item V - New Business

Toma Shaver introduced a couple of our youth shooters who came up and talked about a recent competition. They learned a lot and really appreciate the support given to them by the Club.

Gary Wells outlined things in the range house in need of repair. One major item is the roof is in poor shape. Other items include paint, siding, and skirting. Pat agreed to meet Gary at the range next Wed to go over the list.

Pat Mileshosky discussed a recent behavior problem that happened on the range, including safety rule violations and belligerent behavior. Attempts were made to this member to come to the meeting and speak in their defense, but all attempts were rebuked. A motion was made to dismiss this person, seconded and passed.

Pat also asked for \$300 to purchase 9 railroad ties to get the Action Handgun shipping containers up off the ground. A motion was made, seconded, and passed.

Item VI - Adjourn

After discussing or deferring all the items on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 8:37 p.m. The next BOD meeting will be held on March 20, 2025, starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Bear Canyon Senior Center, 4656 Pitt NE.

Dues Increase

The Board of Directors continually strives to manage the Club's funds wisely. To ensure the financial health of the club in the medium and long term, we have come to the difficult but necessary decision to raise annual membership fees as follows:

Regular (adults under 65): \$175 (\$30 increase) Senior (adults 65 and over): \$110 (\$15 increase) Associate add-on: \$30 (\$5 increase)

This decision is based on several factors, the first being inflation. We have all been affected by it the past few years, and Zia is no different. Everything costs more. We pay noticeably more today than we did even a couple years ago to maintain the range and run activities for members to enjoy.

Second is our annual lease with the state. Our current 5-year lease, which runs through June 2028, includes significantly higher annual lease payments than in the past. In addition, the payments increase year over year rather than on a per-term basis as they had in the past.

Third is the state-mandated reclamation fund, sometimes referred to by board members as the cleanup fund. This is money held in trust by the state to ensure all cleanup expenses, including lead remediation, will be covered, should Zia vacate its current home. For many years, the state was satisfied with our cleanup fund. As part of the last lease renewal, mainly due to the age of the previous lead remediation estimate, the state notified the Club that the money in this fund needed to be increased by almost \$200,000. To meet this obligation, the Club must pay over \$46,000 into the fund every year over the term of our current lease.

Zia's expenses were greater than its income in 2024 due to these factors, and it is projected that the club will incur losses in 2025 and in the future without this increase. The board did not take this decision lightly. Ultimately, the duty of board members is to work to ensure that Zia remains open so that members can enjoy the Club and financial stewardship is a key part of that duty. For long-term health, non-profit organizations like Zia need to maintain and grow assets - tax status doesn't change the fact that the Club needs money to operate, to achieve its mission, and to protect itself from rainy days or emergencies. We hope you will understand the necessity of this decision to help ensure the financial health of Zia so that we can all enjoy our memberships for many years to come.



For some of you, it is time to renew your Zia membership. How will you know when it is time for you to renew? Check your membership card. The expiration date for your current membership is written on the card. Hint: If you joined in the last year, your expiration date is a year from when you joined.

Online Renewals

You will receive renewal reminder emails 30, 15 and 7 days before your membership expires. If you do not renew by the expiration date, you will have a thirty day grace period, after which time, a \$35 late fee will be added to your dues and your gate key will be deactivated. Once you have paid your dues, plus the late fee, your membership will be reinstated and your gate key reactivated.

The Process

The reminder emails will contain renewal instructions and all the links needed to take the annual test, and log into your account. You and your Associates need to take the annual test, make sure your NRA is up to date, and update your profile page. Check your profile page, and make any changes as necessary (i.e. update NRA expiration date, annual test codes, change of address, phone number, email, etc.) Once you have done that, and paid your dues, new membership card(s) will be mailed to you, your Associates and Juniors.

If you need to change your membership, i.e. add or remove an Associate, update to Senior membership, etc., put in a ticket, explaining the change, and we will update your membership and send a new invoice.

Please note: if you are adding a new Associate, they must take the annual test, separate from you, and enter their code into your profile. They must also attend a New Member Orientation (NMO) class. Once they have been added to your package, they will automatically be added to the NMO list and invited to the next orientation class. Once they have completed the class, they will receive their gate key and membership card.

Mail In Renewals

For those few members, you will receive your renewal form and annual test in the mail. Fill both out and mail them in. As stated above, if you have an Associate (or wish to add one), they must submit an annual test, separate from yours. And, if they are new Associates, they must also attend the New Member Orientation class.

In the 1/5 size category the 4H folks again made a great showing. Nathan H. took overall with 23. It really is exciting to witness these young people perform.

Highlighted scores indicate class winners.

Please note the 5 and 10 in a row pin winners as indicated in the score table.

The matrix for this class structure is:

Master 34 40 AAA 28 33 AA 21 27 A 15 20 B 0 14

This class structure has no bearing on any classifications or qualifications outside of this specific match. The purpose is to allow everyone a fair chance at competition and provide a structure for advancement. The way you advance to the next level is to shoot 3 subsequent scores within the higher range(s). New shooters will shoot "unclassified" and once a score is recorded, that will be the class in which they will shoot until higher scores move them "up".

Small Bore Silhouette shooting is one of the most challenging sports for individual marksmanship. Many great shooting competitions offer challenging shots at long range from a bench or other supported position. All our shooting is done from a standing position swaying in whatever breeze there happens to be. We shoot 10 chickens at 40 yards, 10 pigs at 60 yards, 10 turkeys at 77 yards, and 10 rams at 100 yards. A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus sight in rounds.

We shoot with .22 rim fire rifles with scopes or open sights. Any standard velocity or high velocity .22 short, long, or long rifle ammo is permitted but the extra hot rounds such as the STINGER or VIPER rounds and magnums are prohibited.

The following is information taken from the NRA Silhouette Rifle Rule book and explains the match time sequencing:

Time is not checked on each shot but is computed on the indicated allowance for each five-shot string. The Range Officer may terminate any relay before completion of the full-time allowance, if all competitors in that relay have completed firing.

Time Allowances:

Ready Time - Fifteen seconds will be allowed after the command **READY** is given before the command **FIRE.** Two- and one-half minutes will be allowed to fire one shot on each target of a bank of five targets. Targets are shot in sequential order from left to right.

Alibis - 30 seconds will be allowed for each unfired round of the series in which the alibi is allowed.

Shoot-offs - 30 seconds will be allowed for each shot fired in a shoot off of ties.

A minimum of 30 seconds will be allowed between the commands CEASE FIRE and READY.

The small-bore rifle silhouette match is held on the first Sunday of each month.

Setup starts at 8:00am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set-up and will start the match promptly at 9:00am. This event is open to any Zia member/guest, and all are welcome. Juniors are encouraged to try this fun and challenging shooting sport.

The adjacent bench rest/plinking range to the immediate West of the Small-Bore Rifle Silhouette Range will be closed for the duration of our matches. This will allow us to provide participants with a higher level of safety.

The bench rest rifle silhouette (formerly known as "Mouse Gun") match is held on the second Sunday of each month.

For those of you that are wondering what we do...

For the Standard long range competition:

We take a scoped .22 rifle that has plenty of elevation adjustment and shoots long rifle ammo (**no stingers or hyper velocity**) and we shoot at 1/5 scale targets, whereas the chickens are set a 60 meters and are roughly 2"x2" in size. The pigs which are roughly 3"x4" are set at 100 meters, the turkeys, roughly 3"x5" tall are set at 150, and the rams 6"x4" are at 200 meters. Relays consist of 10 chickens at 60 meters, 10 pigs at 100 meters, 10 turkeys at 150 meters, and 10 rams at 200 meters.

For the Xtended long range competition:

We shoot chickens at 150 yds. pigs at 200 yds., turkeys at 290 yds., and rams at 325 yds. The size of these targets are 3/8 scale much bigger that the standard 1/5 scale targets, but further away.

In order to shoot either long range match:

All you need is a sand bag, maybe a bipod, or perhaps a fancy bench rest rig, it doesn't matter as any type of rest is allowed. At the onset of each 15 minute relay, there are unlimited "sighters" at the beginning sighters being shots that are fired at a 8"x11" steel plate set at the same distance at each of the targets. When you are pretty sure that your rifle is sighted in good enough for that bay of targets, the "sighters" stop and you shoot 10 shots in left to right order in what is remaining of the 15 minute time allotment for score. This all done while sitting at a bench. It is a relaxed atmosphere and a ton of fun! A total of 40 rounds are needed for a match plus "sighters".

Setup starts at 7:30 am. We will have a sight in/practice period starting after set up if possible, and will start the match promptly at 8:00am.

I encourage anyone with a .22 rifle to come out and give this a try! Most folks that have are now hooked. If you have any questions, please call or text Tom 505-350-4026

Please note, on the 2nd Sunday of each month when this match is held on the East range, the F-Class range and the Precision Tactical range is closed for the duration of this event.




